# **Branch Update: South Carolina**

The South Carolina branch recognized a need to better support women in the field who may not be aware of or have an opportunity to be involved in Women of Asphalt. These women usually work long hours and often do not have the chance to attend an in-person event or connect via a virtual webinar. To bridge this need, the South Carolina branch implemented 'Building Community with Biscuits' (BCB). Instead of asking these women to come to them, they bring the message and resources to the women in the field, offering something that has always united people across cultures food. The visits are a coordinated effort between the women on the branch Steering Committee and employers to ensure the visits are welcome and safe for all. They follow up with the employer representative and any of the women who were interested in becoming involved. Through their efforts, they have created a welcoming community for all women in asphalt careers in South Carolina.

# Hear from a Mentee: Amy Glass - CRH Americas Materials

#### What has been your experience so far?

"It has been very comfortable, really refreshing to talk to someone inside the industry, but has an outside perspective removed from the specifics of my company/department. The remote 'coffees' work well and it has been fairly easy to schedule/reschedule meetups."

#### What about the program do you find beneficial?

"It has truly provided new creative ways to address issues. Just getting to talk things out has been nice, you don't always get a chance to do that. My mentor's ideas have been great to try and implement. Just having someone in your corner is huge, tracking the ins and outs of your professional challenges. I've been able to put things out there; ways I want to grow in EVERY area of my life and connect the dots with my professional life. My mentor has had really great input & shared her example in a very encouraging way."

### Any advice for someone thinking about joining?

"I think whatever you feel you could use/learn from this program; it can probably do that for you. I think it is ALWAYS great to share your journey and the intent is truly here for it to benefit you and help you to grow professionally and as a person. Whether you have tried something like this before or not, if you feel a tug, it is definitely worth the effort to try."
